




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
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From the Master Association

The Master Association annual meeting will be held on February 14 at 2 p.m. This year's annual meeting marks the biggest change since the development of Trilogy. The election of the Master Association Directors will be by homeowners, no longer an election by the Delegates. By now, you will have received your ballots. Please mark you ballots and return in the post-paid envelope. After February 11, it can be brought to the office or Annual meeting. Hope to see you there.

Executive Session: The Executive Session was held on January 9 in the Monterey Room. Items acted upon in General Session are reported under that session.

Amenities Negotiations/LOI: - the Negotiating Team met with Jason Enos January 5th and viewed a preliminary drawing of the 4th clubhouse. The Amenities Committee will be providing the Master Board with additional specifications regarding both the 4th clubhouse and the conversion of the current Design Center to a Health & Wellness Center. Approved specifications will become part of the Letter of Intent between the Homeowners Association and Shea Homes. We are happy to report that Shea has agreed to create a labyrinth on the Longspur Drive park/drill site.

Formation of Contracts

- Management Contract review of the management contract with Action Property Management, Inc.
- Legal Services Berding & Weil is legal counsel for the Master Association. A "Waiver of Conflict of Interests" will be signed as Berding & Weil will be representing each Village for the rewrite of their governing documents.

General Session:

- The revised governing documents have been delivered; either by email for those that have chosen to "Opt-In", or by US mail on a USB flash drive. If you have not received, your copy or wish to have a printed copy contact the Administrative Office.
- The Board has been working with Action Property Management to improve services to the members. A staff reorganization has been developed and will be implemented starting with the Administrative Office. A Village Manager will be hired to be responsible for the Villages. (ie: Meetings, Budgets, Architectural and Compliance). This will relieve the General Manager of those duties to allow him to dedicate more time to the responsibilities of the Master Association. As Trilogy accepts additional Common Area and anticipates a remodel of the Delta Club the Board expects more time needed for RFP's and project bidding tasks.



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

Emergency Action Committee

How would you like to meet a great group of residents, make friends and at the same time learn how you can help yourself and your community? Consider volunteering with the Trilogy Emergency Action Committee (EAC). The EAC's mission is to prepare the community for safe and effective responses to emergencies that affect Trilogy residents. We conduct a variety of training, community education and provide support during Trilogy events. Each spring we conduct a mock exercise responding to a staged emergency. During the fall months, we raise community awareness of important health and safety issues, such as how to shelter in place during earthquakes or other incidents. We also work with Rio Vista Fire Department on a Smoke Alarm Awareness campaign to remind Trilogy residents to change batteries twice a year and replace alarms after 10 years.

The EAC supports several Trilogy events and activities throughout the year, including the Trilogy Triathlon, Fourth of July Parade, and WalkTober. Our volunteers conduct traffic control and set up first aid and counseling tents to help participants as needed. These events serve as great training opportunities. The EAC relies on volunteers who live in Trilogy and care about their neighbors. We hold training meetings at 6 p.m. on the second Tuesday of each month in the River Room at the Delta Club. We are always looking for new volunteers. If you have any questions, simply attend a meeting or contact Chair Barry Fraser at 415-407-8529.

Amenities Committee (MAC)

The second change allows for retractable awnings because of modern construction and materials. The Village CC&R's will now read: "Awnings must be retractable, be of modern construction and be a neutral color that will blend with the structure." All other Patio Cover restrictions generally apply.





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

- 2nd Reading Election & Voting Policy the 2nd Reading was approved with the following changes: 1) changed the "Qualifications of Inspector of Elections" that a non-member is not paid by the Association (ie: Association Manager, Accountant or Legal Counsel) 2) the use of Association Media (ie: Print, Electronic and Signs) that was discussed and approved at the December 13 meeting. Policies are posted on MTL.
- Website approved the expenditure from Board Contingency of \$8,000 for the development and implementation of a new website, contracting with Association Voice pending review of the services agreement by legal counsel. This new website will replace MyTrilogyLife.
- Access Control the Access Committee reported on the research and bid responses for improvements at the gate entrances. The Board approved management to upgrade the existing computer and software and to keep the current access method of transponders.

New Business:

• 4th Clubhouse – the Amenities Committee submitted their recommendation of the following six factors that need to drive the concept of the clubhouse: 1) the need for a space larger than the Diablo Ballroom for special events and presentations; 2) Additional meeting rooms, 3) New or additional storage; 4) Better kitchen facilities; 5) Table tennis and Pickleball are growing and

- need to be addressed; 6) Flexibility and multiuse are critical factors. The Board supported the initial concept and approved the Negotiating Team to take this information and discuss considering a 14,000 sqf clubhouse.
- Health & Wellness after approval of the use of the Design Center to be a Health and Wellness Center, the Amenities Committee were task to create a more detailed plan. The details submitted: the current rotunda will be used as a waiting/ relaxation area; the large room with a window wall overlooking the golf course will be used for exercise equipment; current theater room will be used for "quiet" classes such as yoga and meditation; the current showroom will become a group exercise room; the current office space will house the massage therapists, acupuncturist and naturopath, as well as the Fitness Director and staff. The Board approved the Negotiating Team to take these to Shea Homes/Jason Enos to begin estimating the costs of the conversion.

Tennis Courts and Delta Pool Deck Renovation agenda items were tabled but at a later Board meeting the Board authorized bid solicitation for complete replacement of Tennis courts 1 & 2.





Health Challenges of Aging and How Acupuncture Can Help

"Old age, believe me, is a good and pleasant thing. It is true you are gently shouldered off the stage, but then you are given such a comfortable front stall as spectator."

-- Confucius, ancient Chinese teacher and philosopher.

Could this be the fate of the aging as Confucius decreed? To be able to enjoy the golden years of life implies a life well lived, and that a good, if not excellent, standard of health was maintained. How to live a life with vitality and exuberance, one that can last until the time of death is not a foolish quest, but one that is recognized by practitioners of acupuncture and Oriental medicine as realistic and completely within reach.

For those of us who have grown up in the west, our attitudes towards the elderly and aging, in general, are not always so encouraging. As the American actress/comedian Lucille Ball humorously put it: "The secret of staying young is to live honestly, eat slowly, and lie about your age."

The earlier an individual can start using a practitioner of acupuncture and Oriental medicine, the better. This is because there is a huge emphasis on disease prevention. Historically speaking, practitioners of ancient China did not profit from their patient's sickness, but from their wellness. Payment was rendered only when the patient exhibited good health. Of course, not even the great physicians of ancient China were able to find the proverbial Fountain of Youth. Growing old gracefully requires wisdom in order to properly manage expectations.

There is an adage describing the philosophy of acupuncture and Oriental medicine: "The superior doctor prevents sickness, the mediocre doctor attends to impending sickness, and the inferior doctor treats actual sickness." A superior practitioner can catch the subtleties within the body that, if left untreated, can manifest as illness. These warning signs can be detected in several ways, such as pulse diagnosis.

Pulse diagnosis allows a practitioner of acupuncture and Oriental medicine to 'listen' or 'feel' the state of a patient's internal organs. This is done by asking the patient to relax and rest their arms comfortably with the palm-side up. The practitioner generally uses three fingers to press on the delicate area of the radial artery pulse. Each finger lies over an area representing different internal organs.

Each time the heart beats, blood is pushed out through the arteries. The resulting pressure from the surge of blood flowing can be easily palpated at the radial artery. A practitioner feels for more than just the heart rate, or what is termed beats per minute (bpm). Qualities such as the strength, width, rhythm, and depth of the pulse provide valuable information. In addition to being ableto assess individual organs, a patient's blood quality and state of Qi may be ascertained. Qi is the most fundamental energy necessary for all life to exist.




Bocce
