From the Master Association

Executive Session: The Executive Session was held on February 13 in the Monterey Room. Items acted upon in General Session are reported under that session.

Amenities Negotiations/LOI: The Negotiating Team met with Jason Enos February 7, 2017.

Dog Park – of the proposed improvements, three were removed as they are planned to be installed by Shea. The Association portion of Dog Park improvements is estimated to be around \$58,000 and the Dog Club has agreed to dedicate \$15,000 to that cost.

4th Clubhouse – In answer to our question posed at the last meeting, Jason indicated a building of 12,000 SF is most likely the largest building for this site. Jason plans to get preliminary costs for the building discussed. He will then determine what his contribution will be. We reviewed costs for fixtures, furnishings and equipment.

A meeting is scheduled with the Amenities Committee and Patty Kohn to review preliminary specs for the Health & Wellness Center.

Our next meeting will be in late March after Jason has obtained cost estimates.

Formation of Contracts

- **Beer & Wine License** – the Board is reviewing the option to obtain a Beer & Wine license. In order to have all the information of how this would benefit the Association, the procedure is to complete an application. After the Board has all the information, the consideration of obtaining the license will be provided to the Community Advisory Committee for discussion of the concept with the membership and provide feedback and written recommendation to the Board.
- **Streetlight LED RFP** – after much investigation and consideration the Board has directed management to create an RFP to replace the existing streetlights with LED bulbs of 2,700 Kelvin & 1,800 Lumens.
- **Committee Announcement** – The majority of the members of the Clubhouse Improvements Committee have submitted their resignations. This leaves openings on that committee, and all standing committee appointments are reviewed and appointed for May. Please consider volunteering on a committee. The Association needs your knowledge, experiences and community spirit to continue to support the services provided.

- **2017/18 Budget** – the Board approved the proposed Budget. The assessment for 2017/18 will be \$128.84. Note: this is the Master Association Assessment, which does not include the amount assessed by each Village.

After ten years, smoke detectors run the risk of not working in the event of a fire. Also, smoke detector batteries should be replaced at least once a year and the Fire Department recommends replacing batteries every six months. If you buy new batteries or new smoke detectors, the Rio Vista Fire Department will install them for you. - **Management Contract** – the management contract with Action Property Management was renewed for 1 year. The monthly base fee is \$18,743.00 (Annually = \$221,676). Adding additional costs, such as Administrative Extras (printing/accounting/collections) which is about \$25,000, as well as burden rate ranging between 23%-38%, which covers benefits/payroll/worker's comp/disability, the total cost of management services is around \$660,000.
- **Engagement of a consultant for a Management RFP** – the Board is expected to review contracts and perform a bid process on contracts at least every 3 years. Since 2005, the management contract has been awarded to Action Property Management, Inc. The Board has for the last few years planned to perform an RFP review. Due to other, higher priority projects, the Board has not yet been completed. The Board has approved a contract with a Sequoia Grove Consulting for \$10,000, plus transportation reimbursement (est. \$5,000), to create an RFP for future management services.

New Business:

- **Tennis Courts Renovation** – the Board has approved the following work: #1 Asphalt Replacement/Color Coat (\$62,000), #3/#4 Crack Repair/New Color Coat (\$8,000), awarded the con-

tract to Saviano Company, Inc. Work is expected to begin in early March

The Master Association Annual meeting was held immediately following. The meeting was well attended. While the ballots were being tabulated by the 'Inspectors of Election', reports will given by the Board, Committees and Management.

I would like to acknowledge Catherine Patrick, Assistant General Manager. Catherine has worked for TRVMA for 8½ years. She has been an asset to our organization but is retiring and moving closer to family. We all thank her for her dedication and wish her the best in her new home.

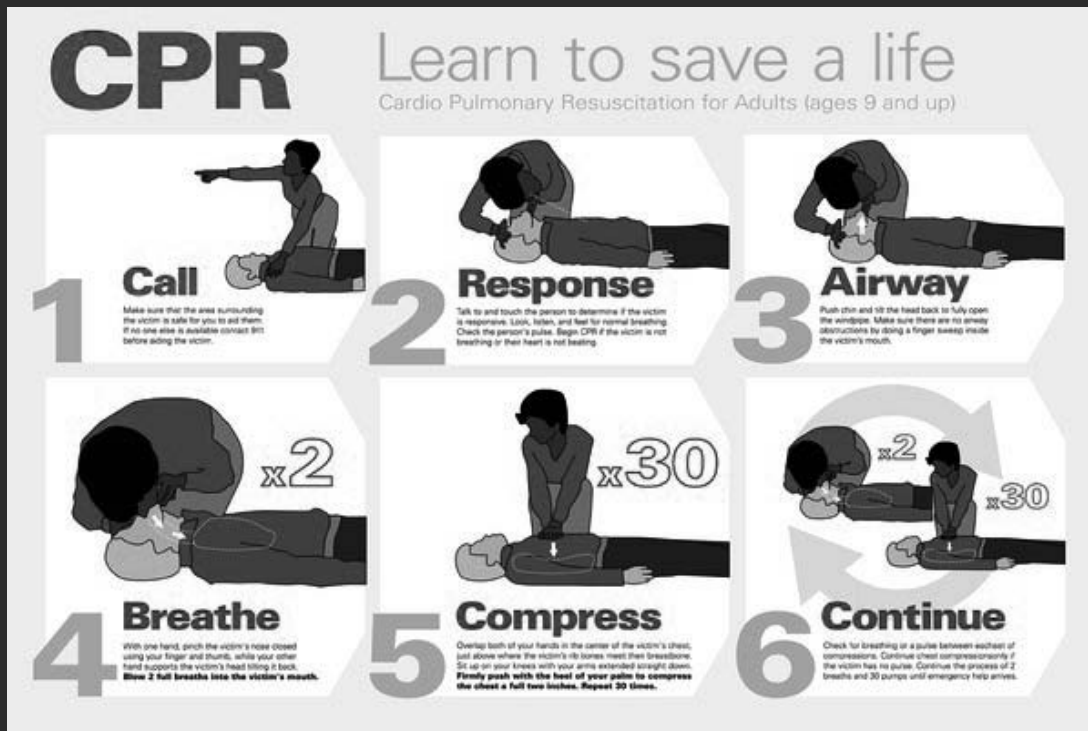

However, there are ways to be as sure as you can that your research reveals the correct family relationship and information. Here are five ways you can tell if your genealogy research is most likely correct. 1. You have found the same information in more than one set of records. 2. Your research matches the research of other people. 3. Reverse engineer someone else's work. 4. Look for confirmation for your wild assumptions. 5. Get DNA evidence. While DNA may not be able to tell you the exact names of your particular ancestors, it can definitely put you in a suspected ancestor's family (or take you out of it) without a doubt. Genealogy can be imprecise and uncertain by nature. This is truer the farther back you go. People weren't always as careful about accurate record-keeping, and making up noble lines of descent to make a family seem more prestigious was common. Being as sure as you can be is the same as declaring victory in genealogy.

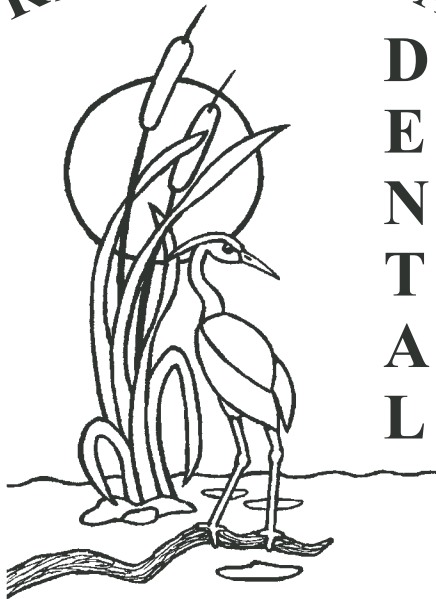
