The Master Board is working on a number of projects and deliberating on many, many issues. Information on those issues that may be of greatest interest to the members is in the Highlights section below. Details of all other agenda items are included under Executive Session and General Session.

### **Highlights**

- Director Fraser resigned from the Master Board effective April 11. As she was the CFO, following the regular Board Meeting an organizational meeting was held and Director Coleman was elected CFO. Next month, which method to use to fill the vacant position will be determined: select the next highest vote-getter from the recent election; or allow members to submit candidate statements and have the Board select from that pool.
- A golf course committee is not being established at this time. The Board will continue to examine options including: 1) hiring a consultant, 2) examining alternative uses, such as a greenbelt, and 3) reviewing ownership and funding options.
- A contract with an architect who will provide recommendations on the Delta Club renovation was approved.
- The Negotiating Team met with Jason Enos, President of Shea Homes, Northern California, and discussed the fourth clubhouse. He indicated a building of 8,400 SF would cost \$1.5 million. The Board will hold a special meeting to discuss the budget and funding options after receiving cost estimates for the Delta Club, the Health and Wellness Center, and the final contribution from Shea Homes (RVCP) for the fourth clubhouse.
- A new community outreach program, "Ask a Board Member," is under way. Once a month, a table will be set up at the Vista or Delta Club to receive Member input. On May 17 from 11 a.m.
  1 p.m. two members of the Board will be at the Vista Club.

### Executive Session: The Executive Session was held April 10. The following items were discussed:

### Legal/Litigation

- The Board closed out an issue related to Common Area tree trimming. The Member has been notified.
- The Board agreed to reimburse a homeowner up to a maximum amount for landscaping that will enable putting a stop sign on a street sign on Silver Ridge Drive.
- Progress has been made in the review of Common Area deeds by Director Coleman and Association legal counsel.
- President Kohn was directed to sign Shea assessment bond releases.
- Director Fraser presented information related to licensing. The license for an Esthetician establishment, which is issued by the CA Department of Consumer Affairs, Board of Barbering and (continued on p. 16)

### The Five Most Common Violations



The five most frequent areas needing attention/maintenance in the community are:

- Faded mailboxes and/or leaning mailbox stands
- Tree limbs overhanging the street or blocking streetlights
- Unkempt lawn and shrubbery
- Trash bins which are not stored in an enclosure or the garage
- Expired guest passes on the street or driveway

If you see the new compliance coordinator in your neighborhood, be sure to say hello! She will be inspecting your community to make sure the property looks top notch. What a thankless job!

### The Drought is Over!

Now that the drought is "officially" over, diligent lawn maintenance is more important than ever. Whether you have mostly turf, or a "40% green" landscape, irrigation is critical. While the City of Rio Vista has not yet lifted its three-day-a-week irrigation limitation, that should be more than enough to keep landscape features alive. The goal is to make sure that all vegetation is green and properly maintained. If your lawn suffered during the drought, now is the time to bring it back to life or replace it. Compliance is mandatory, so please be a good neighbor and participate in the attractive, re-greening of the community. Landscapes are essential to the quality of life in Trilogy by providing areas for visual enjoyment, recreation, and as an enhancement to the environment.

According to the Solano County Mosquito Abatement Program, standing water found within residential neighborhoods can produce enough adult mosquitoes to bother not only the residents of the home, but of many surrounding homes. Take these simple precautions to prevent this from happening:

- Repair or replace defective faucets or pipes immediately.
- Maintain roof gutters and downspouts clear of debris.
- Flower Pots: Drain excess water or invert if not in use.
- Bird Baths: Change water frequently.
- Lawns: Avoid over-watering. Pay close attention to standing water in irrigation drains around you home. Treat drains with chemicals to eliminate larvae.

The Solano County Mosquito Abatement Program can help if you are dealing with standing water. They can recommend different solutions than a pest control company. Call them at 707-437-1116 or find more helpful information online at http://www.solanomosquito.com/.



Cosmetology, had been cancelled inadvertently in 2015. The Board directed the President and the General Manager to complete and submit an application for a new license. Note: The application was submitted and approval was given to continue services.

•The Association water bill was not paid on time due to some processing errors. The late charges, totaling \$964.40, will be paid by Action Property Management.

### **Formation of Contracts**

- An Agreement provided by Allen Schafer, Architect, was reviewed. This Agreement involves the renovation of the Delta Club.
- Director Coleman updated the board on her work with the consultant who is helping develop an RFP for a management company. Interviews will be held later in April with key staff, and board members will be receiving a survey. The project is on schedule.
- President Kohn advised the Board of changes that were requested to the Service Agreement with Association Voice, the proposed website provider.

### **Personnel**

- Applications for Board-appointed Committees were reviewed and the Board agreed to put several names into nomination for approval at the General Session.
- Director Auslen agreed to serve as the Board Liaison to the Access Committee.
- GM Vitrano reviewed the staffing-related changes made in the Member Services department. The Board asked for a report on budgeted versus current staff and shifts.
- President Kohn reviewed the results of the Amenities Committee survey regarding Walking Paths.
- The Board agreed to allow a staff member to rent the Diablo Ballroom for a special event at the Member rate.

### **General Session**

 The Board approved the Service Agreement with Association Voice as amended. GM Vitrano will examine the insurance policy for liability limits related to a website, and a disclaimer will be put on the new website.

- A first reading of a policy related to production clubs (Trilogy Council for the Arts, the VIP Drama Club, and the Theatre Group) was presented. The Board voted to amend the Clubs policy based on:

  1) the current Rules and Regulations document regarding club status, and 2) the proposed revisions that relate to the special circumstances regarding these production clubs. This was assigned to the Administrative Policy Review Committee.
- The following appointments were made effective May 1, 2017 for a one-year term except as noted:
  - Amenities Committee: Lori Azzolino and Richard Pettijohn
  - Administrative Policy Review: Ron Steiner
  - Eagle Point Board of Directors: Mark Weiss and Lynn Bratchett
  - Community Advisory Committee: Isi Mangiben, who for the last few months filled the remaining term of Walt Manos, was appointed to serve a three-year term.
- The Table Tennis Club requested \$2,070 from the Reserve Fund to reimburse them for tables they have already purchased. The Board declined this reimbursement as the appropriate process for purchase of Association items is for the Board to review estimates and authorize purchase in advance. GM Vitrano will investigate reserve funds and recommend new tables to the Board.
- The survey conducted by the Amenities Committee indicated interest by 61% of respondents in Walking Paths with Outdoor Exercise Equipment. The Board assigned research into this option to the Amenities Committee.
- The Board approved an expenditure of \$8,250 plus expenses and a 10% administrative overhead fee for the design, development, and administration of renovations to the Delta Club and to award the work to Allen Schafer, Architect.
- The Board discussed striping tennis courts 3 and 4 for Pickleball. A motion was made, but it was not seconded.

# RICHARD & MARY McDEVITT A life-changing story



When the McDevitts lost a combined 225 pounds, Richard was fit enough to carry Mary across the threshold of their new home.
