

President

Executive Session: The Executive Session was held on 11/07/16 in the Monterey Room. Items acted upon in General Session are reported under that session.

Legal/Litigation

- Verification of Association Property: Association received a report from Berding & Weil of all the property identified within Trilogy regarding what has and has not been deeded to the Association. The next step in this process is to work with Shea Homes to convey the existing common to the Association and contact Marks-McCormack to gather information and requirements to obtain approval to place improvements across the Drill Site properties.
- Amenities Negotiations/MOU: The Amenities Negotiating Team, Patty Kohn and Don Love, have requested that our legal counsel work with Shea's attorney on developing an amenities agreement.
- Common Area Tree Trimming: request from a resident was tabled until Board of Directors had an opportunity to view the issue.
- Exclusive Use Common Area: request was denied at this time, as the area is not currently common area to the Association.

Personnel

- Committee Nominations: There were no names submitted since the last meeting for openings on the Adult or Ad Hoc Streetlight Committees. Several of the committees have openings. Anyone who has an interest in any of the committee areas, please contact the Administrative Office for an application.
- Staffing Minimum Wage: the Board continued the discussion on methods on how to adhere to the minimum wage requirements, and the impact on the salary schedule. This will be finalized when the Budget is prepared in the next few months.
- Operations Review: due to time limitations, this was tabled for a future meeting on 11/18/16.
- **Board Liaison Appointments:** Liaison's were appointed to all the standing committees.

Formation of Contracts

- Renovation/Future Amenities Design/Build Consideration: This was to consider expanding the previously approved project of Design Consultants to review the Delta, to include the Design Center and the future clubhouse. At this time, the Design consultants will review the Delta Club, on the current use of the facility and the needs identified for a remodel.
- Vista Club Antenna: the Board reviewed the existing antennas installed on the Vista owned by Internet Planet and Warrior Golf and a request from Internet Planet to change the size and quantity of antennas. The request from Internet Planet was approved with no changes to the contract.







General Session:

Unfinished Business:

- ByLaw Adoption and Seating of the Delegates: the revised ByLaws were formerly adopted and the new Delegates (Village Presidents) were recognized and seated. Thank you to the Past Delegates. Your service to the community is very much appreciated.
- Document Distribution to Members: the Board approved to contract with Landmark Image (Vacaville, CA) for \$5,780 to distribute our new governing documents. For those homeowners who have not chosen to Opt-In (receive official documents via email) will receive the documents on a USB flash drive. Documents will be distributed once they have been officially recorded.
- Inspector of Election Services: with the pending community-wide voting for the Master Board Directors and the expectation of the number of ballots returned, the Board has approved contracting with an election service, Inspector of Elections for \$9,205. The service will: 1) mail out the Ballots and the candidate's statements 2) receive the ballots 3) arrive on-site and perform the counting of the ballots electronically. The service provides the following benefits: 1) verification of the ballots without any suspension of tampering, ballots are collected and secured by an independent inspector, 2) timely counting electronically which

can't be done manually – which often requires re-counting and verification. The Board additionally authorized that return postage be covered by the Association, which will cost \$.63 per return.

New Business:

- Activities Cooperative Event / Soroptimist Fund Raiser: The Activities Director proposed a Life Enrichment program presented by the Soroptimist. The request failed due to lack of motion for the following reason; current policies dictate the facilities are not to be used for organizational fundraisers. All proposed monies collected were to be donations to charitable organizations.
- Labyrinth: After the installation of the Vista patio shades and the furniture, the Labyrinth became unusable as a 24/7 available amenity. A request for a replacement was brought forth at the 2016/17 budget. At that time, the Board was reviewing possible sites, and working on other priority projects. The Board has requested staff to review the list of possible sites, and provide a report at the December meeting. The report was to consider location, size, and composition specifically for required level of maintenance.
